The VA National Center for Lung Cancer Screening (NCLCS) supports systematic, integrated, and equitable access to high quality lung cancer screening processes for Veterans.

The mission of the Center is to reduce lung cancer related mortality and morbidity by leveraging a learning health care system to increase systematic and equitable access to evidence-based lung cancer screening through a collaborative, interdisciplinary network.

NCLCS provides education and support to clinical teams regarding LCS standards of care, VHA policy, best practices, as well as data and policy recommendations to central VA leadership.




Percentages of eligible Veterans who were offered LCS, by Race/Ethnicity
